## MINUTES – TAC Meeting September 13, 2023

Kent Fugal made the motion to approve the minutes as corrected to show him present at the TAC meeting on September 13<sup>th</sup>. Jeff Sneddon seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, the motion passed.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

## FY2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Darrell West discussed the FY2024 TIP with TAC. TAC asked for state funded bridge projects to be shown in the TIP. These will be shown in the Performance Measures section. Key Number 24285 needs to be corrected. It is shown as a Bonneville County project, it is a City of Idaho Falls project. Table I will be updated to reflect this change. Lance Bates made the motion to recommend approval of the FY

2024 TIP to the Policy Board with the corrections made. Austin Black seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous, the motion passed.

## **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

# **Carbon Reduction Program Update**

DaNiel Jose discussed the Carbon Reduction Program with TAC members.

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)/Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) provides funding and guidance for the Carbon Reduction Program.

Law requires State DOTs to develop a Carbon Reduction Strategy that:

- Supports efforts to reduce transportation emission
- Identifies projects and strategies that will reduce transportation emissions
- Is appropriate to the population and context of the state
- The draft CRS is to be updated every 4 years

It is still in discussion on how these funds would be allocated.

## **Neighborhood Equity and Access Grant**

Darrell West gave the following information on the grant submittal.

The application was well done and completed and submitted on time.

\$400,000 of funding was requested.

The timeline for the announcement of awarded applications in unknown. Could be 4-6 months but might be sooner.

If awarded project would likely start at the beginning of fiscal year 2025 (October 1, 2024)

- 4. Post Falls Highway District Huetter Road (District 1) \$7.5 million
- 5. Post Falls Spokane Street (District 1) \$1.2 million
- 6. Hayden Ramsey Road (District 1) \$2.5 million
- 7. Ammon Ammon Road (District 6) \$2.0 million
- 8. Lewiston Snake River Avenue (only project in District 2) \$3.7 million
- 9. Eagle Downtown Mobility Improvements (only project in District 3 Boise Urban Area) \$5.7 million
- 10. Bonneville County Iona Road (District 6) \$8.1 million
- 11. Twin Falls Eastland Drive (only project in District 4) \$8.5 million

Schedule: ITD Districts/HQs review of MPO recommendations for Strategic Initiatives Grant Program was delayed from October 6 to October 13.

ITD staff recommendation to ITD Board target date has moved from October to November.

There may be multiple factors that go into ITD modifying the MPO list. One example is if it is determined that every District/Large Urban area should be awarded a project then this puts the Bonneville County Iona Road project in jeopardy of being dropped from the MPO list, whereas:

A project from District 5/Pocatello MPO area did not score high enough to make the MPO list The two District 5/Pocatello MPO area project cost estimates are \$7.6 and \$10 million. The Twin Falls project is the only project in District 4. The Eagle project is the only project in District

3/Boise Urban area and only has a price tag of \$5.7 million.

The remaining project costs until the number 4 ranked Post Falls HD project, all have smaller costs.
